

Coffin

(Or Better Known As the Toe-Pincher Coffin)

Materials:

- 2—4x8 ½ inch cheap plywood \$11 a sheet at Lowes
- 3—8ft 2x2 cheapest you can buy \$2each at Lowes
- Drywall Screws
- Paint (what you want, see my paint section for ideas)

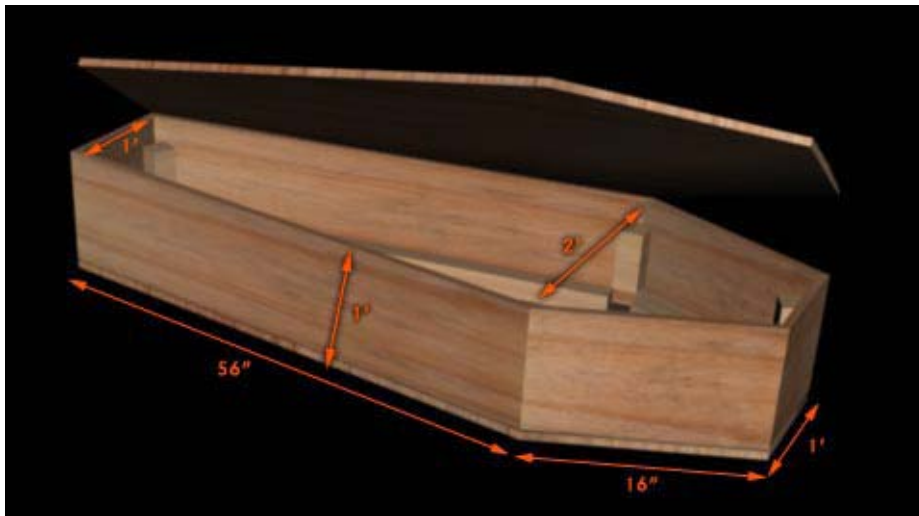
Optional: (For effect)

- Blacklights
- Chains
- Skeleton Hand



Step 1

- Measure out the Top and Bottom and cut out
- Cut out the 2x2 to length (a little less than the length of the sides) and screw to the bottom

Step 2

- Cut out Sides (if your carefully you can get all the sides from one of the plywoods being able to use most of the second for other projects like the tombstones)
- Screw the sides to the 2x2s



Step 3

- Brace the Corners with more of the 2x2



Step 4

- Add Top



Step 5 –Paint

- Paint the Inside (I painted my inside red)
- Paint the Outside (Grey)

For my Coffin I got 2 cans of Red Wine spray paint for the inside, and 2 cans of Grey spray paint for the outside. I choose the cheapest way to do it. A 5qt of paint was going to cost \$10-20 a can; where the spray paint was \$3 a can for the red and \$1 for the grey. If you use the spray paint then do 2 coats, which is still only 1 ½ cans. Using the Spray paint gave the coffin a nice spotty paint job (not one solid color)(adding a nice effect)

Paint Choices

- Red –Demon, Vampire
- Green –Zombie, Mad Scientist
- Blue –Graveyard, eerie



Step 6-Finishing Touches (Optional)

- Add a Blacklight to give off the nice glow from the paint (I used a 24inch form Eliminator.com)
- Add chains to the Top with a Skeleton Hand reaching out
